Dear Parents and Caregivers

#### Tēnā koutou katoa

There is a hive of activity around the school as I write this today: Year 1&2 team are walking to Dingle Dell Reserve for the study on Minibeasts, Year 5&6 students are competing at the Bay Suburbs Rugby tournament and Paikea are having their Jump June Skip off. A fantastic fundraising event that the students have really got behind. I will let them report on this in the last newsletter of the term.

It was so nice to meet new families to the school at our New Parent Morning Tea on Friday 2 June. Once again we had some local families, as well families who had just arrived in New Zealand. We welcome you to the St Heliers whanau.

There were 23 families at the open morning for Term 3 new entrants on Thursday 8 June. Mrs. Alex Wood, the Deputy Principal, talked the parents about starting school for new entrants and general information about the school, while the children got a small taste of school in the classroom with Mrs. Cran and Mrs. Lyon. They will have a second visit before they all start next term.

There is currently a chronic shortage of trained teachers in the primary school sector. With many teachers leaving teaching altogether, or deciding to work part time, we are finding it increasingly difficult to fill vacancies. If you know of a trained teacher who is looking to get back into teaching, then we would love to hear from them.

Book Week is Week 10 and I am sure your children are already preparing what they will be wearing for the Book Parade on Tuesday 27 June. We also have the Scholastic book fair and appreciate all the support from parents and grandparents. I know for all children the library is one of their favourite places at school.

Teachers have completed writing reports and these are now being checked ready to go out prior to the Three-Way Conferences on Thursday 29 June. In the last two newsletters we provided information on how the process has changed, and why. Children will be active participants in their conference. The level of interaction will be appropriate to their year level. In Year 1 the teacher facilitates the conference, guiding the children, while in Year 8 the child is mostly leading the conference. Some of you who come from other schools will have experienced Three-Way conferences already.

A group of Glendowie College students as part of their Middle Years Program are excited to be given the task of a community project. Their group have decided to fundraise for the Middlemore foundation 'Jammies In June', a charity that gives pyjamas to children who need them. They will be holding a bake sale at St Heliers School tomorrow, Friday 16 June from 2.45pm for parents and then at 3pm for students. The bake sale will be near the school office outside the hall.

I would like to thank Mr Hornibrook and his company, The Cosmetic Clinic New Zealand, for donating the money to purchase two high quality basketball hoops and Mr Raymond Wu for personally donating the money for the sandbags. Paikea team are making good use of the old ones from the hall. If parents happen to be in the hall please do not allow the children to move these without an adult as they are heavy and could cause an injury.

I will be away most of next week at the Auckland Primary Principals Association Conference in Taupo. I will miss seeing the children's smiling faces each day, but I will be sure that those with a birthday will get their birthday pen on my return.

### **CISV New Zealand**

Building global friendship

I would like to provide the opportunity for families at St Heliers School to become involved in Childrens International Summer Villages, or CISV. CISV International had its beginning over 70 years ago. CISV is not affiliated with any religion or political organisation and is completely non-profit. The aim is to promote cross cultural friendships around the world and many of the activities revolve around peace and education. You will see from the logo that CISV is an official partner of UNESCO of the United Nations.

I have been associated with CISV for over 30 years and has provided me with life changing experiences. Four times I have been a leader of a delegation of four 11 year old children travelling to camps in Australia, Denmark, Korea and the Philippines. I have been an international staff member in Guatemala and Argentina, hosted staff here in Auckland twice and once I have been the director.

Each year CISV New Zealand receives invitations to attend camps around the globe. Each camp is made up of 12 delegations from different countries, 6 junior councillors, 4-6 host staff and the director and these last for four weeks.

Covid has affected CISV and invitations will not be received again until next year at the earliest, for 2025.

However CISV is not just about sending children to camps abroad. There are smaller, local activities for children aged from 9 to 18.

Although this is short notice there is a one night minicamp coming up on Saturday 24 June to Sunday 25 June. The camp is for children 9 years old right through to 13.

Most of the leaders at the camps are teachers, nurses or students and have been trained to run the CISV programmes. If you google CISV International or CISV New Zealand there are thousands of hits. The photos will give you some insight to the programme.


