**Dear Parents and Caregivers** 

Tēnā koutou katoa

I hope you all had an enjoyable long weekend for Waitangi Day. It was nice to see some fine weather over the weekend.

I would like to say how nice it was to see families returning to school both on Friday last week and Tuesday this week. The children all looked very happy to be returning to school and have settled into their new classes extremely well. After the stalled start due to the terrible Auckland flood we are now well into the routine of school. As devastating as it was, it has been a much smoother start to the year than it was last year when parents were not able to enter the school and masking made it hard to identify children.

I would like to warmly welcome our new families to St Heliers School. We have many children in Year 1 who have just started school, families who have moved into the area and their children have started across the whole school. As well, we welcome our International Students who come to New Zealand with their family and usually stay for the year. On Thursday 2 March we have a special morning tea for new families starting this year. The Senior Leadership Team will be hosting this and it is a lovely opportunity to meet other families, find out a little more about the school and ask any questions you have. More details will be sent out closer to the date.

I would also like to welcome our new teachers; Mrs Alison Copeland who is teaching Year 7 in Room 18, Miss Allegra Scales, also teaching Year 7 in Room 19, Mrs Kiley Gillingham, teaching Year 6 in Room 23 and Melanie Mosmen, teaching Year 5 in Room 21. They are already saying how much they are enjoying their new classes.

I am delighted to welcome Lou Yanyan (known to the children as Lou laoshi) from China who is our Mandarin Language Assistant (MLA) for the whole year. She is being hosted by one of our lovely school families, the Paul family. Yanyan will be teaching Mandarin for the whole year from Year 1 through to Year 8.

Miss Katie Gormley also started this week as our specialist Science Teacher. From next week every class in Year 7 and 8 will have a block of science every week. This is a new initiative and we know the children will benefit greatly from it. Katie will be working in conjunction with the class teacher so that the science can compliment the inquiry being undertaken in class. This year, Year 7&8 students will continue with technology at Selwyn College, they will all attend on a Monday,

You will know by now that your child belongs to a team of 6 or 7 classes covering 2 Year levels. This is different from last year where the team only comprised of 3 or 4 classes. Rather than calling the teams by their year level we wanted to come up with a name for the teams. I will be announcing the common theme to the children at the morning assemblies next week and you will be able to ask them what it is. From there we will need the children's help to decide the individual names for each of the four teams.


