REPORTING ON STUDENT PROGRESS POLICY

NAG 2 No. 201

Purpose

To ensure parents have access to their child's progress at school in each curriculum area, and to assist with developing links between the school and home.

Guidelines

- 1. The statutory requirement to report to parents/caregivers on their child's progress is detailed in the Education Act.
- 2. Parents and caregivers will have reasonable access to their child's details of progress and achievement at school.
- 3. Notice of access to information should be given by a parent or caregiver to the school allowing sufficient time to collate relevant information.
- 4. There will be a 'Meet the Teachers Evening' held early in term one.
- 5. Teachers will outline programmes of work, learning and behavioural expectations of students, and general class routines in a termly team newsletter.
- 6. Formal reporting, in written form, on a child's progress and achievement will be provided through mid-year and end of year written reports.
- 7. Children do not receive a written report for one term or less at \$t\$ Heliers School
- 8. Specific formal opportunities will be provided at the time of mid year reports for parents or caregivers and child to conference with individual teachers their child's learning in person.
- 9. A parent or caregiver can expect to be contacted by the teacher/school, prior to the above formal opportunities, if there are significant academic or behavioural issues requiring intervention.
- 10. Approaches to discuss a child's progress at a time other than those formal times can be made either through the school office or by making an appointment directly with the class teacher.
- 11. All information relating to students is subject to the Privacy Act provisions.
